Weeks Parker, Jr. French Horn Two Chair

The French Horn Two Chair is given in honor of Weeks Parker by his family. Weeks has been an active Snyder Member for over fifty years. He has held a variety of positions in the life of the church but is best known for his work in evangelism, music, and video ministry. His video ministry has insured the preservation of some most significant moments in Snyder's history. Weeks was a part of the "Big Band Era" by organizing his own 12 piece orchestra that played a weekly radio program broadcast live on W.F.L.B. from the Ray Avenue U.S.O. Club in Fayetteville. Weeks also taught band in college and high school for fourteen years. In the 1970's he helped begin a church orchestra at Snyder that eventually led to the establishment of the current Snyder Orchestra that began in 2000. We are thankful for his contribution to music in the Fayetteville community and this permanent reminder of his love and support for his church.

C. Parker and Mildred B. Poole Concertmaster Chair

The Concertmaster chair is given in memory of Parker and Mildred Poole by their family. Mrs. Poole served on the study committee of First Baptist Church that recommended establishing "a church on the hill" which became Snyder Memorial Baptist Church. They were charter members and Mr. Poole served as the first Moderator in 1949, a position which he filled on three other occasions. He served as a deacon for 17 years. Mrs. Poole was one of the first women to be elected a deacon. Both taught Sunday School and served on numerous committees. Mr. Poole served as chairman of three Building Committees: the original sanctuary, the present sanctuary, and the north wing. Always innovative, Mrs. Poole was a leader in promoting change to strengthen the ministries and programs of Snyder Memorial. As individuals and as a couple they were driving forces in the early success of the church.

Pastor's Perspective

I've been thinking about missed blessings. All of us could agree that we are beneficiaries of God's many blessings every day. I often wonder, however, how many of His blessings we miss. John's Gospel tells us the story of Thomas not seeing the resurrected Jesus the first time he appeared to the disciples because he wasn't with them. It doesn't say where Thomas was, just that he wasn't there. What an incredible blessing he missed! I am convinced that we, too, forfeit so many more of the blessings God intends to give us - primarily because we aren't always where we need to be or doing what we should be doing.

Last Sunday was a good example. Watching our children lead us in worship at both services warmed my heart and brought tears to my eyes. Listening to Lynne O'Quinn's heart as she shared her testimony about God's work through His Little Ones Ministry stirred my mind and heart about the opportunities we have to partner with God in His work and the unlimited potential that exists right here in our congregation if we will just catch His vision.
