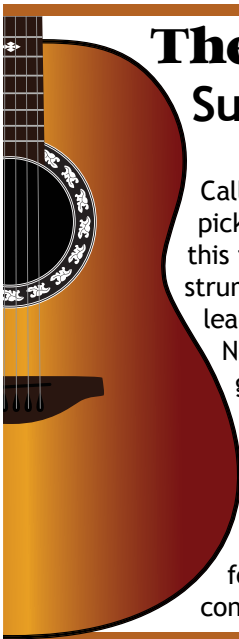

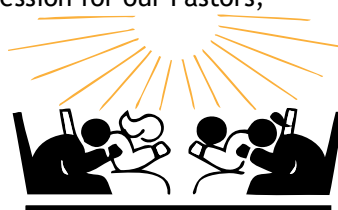

Pastor's Perspective

In a wealthy home some utensils are made of gold and silver, and some are made of wood and clay. The expensive utensils are used for special occasions, and the cheap ones are for everyday use--- 2 Timothy 2:20

Anyone who has ever been a part of ministry in the church knows that there are "special occasion" types of ministries. These are out of the ordinary ministries through which we serve God. Like silver and gold, these ministries shine and accomplish great things for God. I think about the Singing Christmas Tree. It certainly is a golden ministry.

There are "everyday" ministries too. These are no less important to the Kingdom of God. One of these everyday ministries is the Grief Support Group we have here at Snyder. Week in and week out Dale Averitt shows up and helps guide those who enter the doors through the "valley of the shadow of death". It is a ministry that some in our church don't even know exists, that is, until they find themselves in that valley.

One group member said this about the group, "I could not have made it without this special group...we are taught (in the group) to embrace death and not run from it...I am getting through one day at a time because I know at the end of my journey healing will come."

Another had this to say, "No two people grieve alike...(grieving) is hard work and as much as it hurts we learn to come out of denial...I feel so at ease and comfortable with this group of wonderful people."

Still another said this, "These people are my support...I have no one to share my loss with that understands my emotions. I need this group...when I can't come I feel alone and I can't wait to get back to the group."

The grief group is one of those ordinary vessels that is filled with something special—God's Holy Spirit. Through God's leading, Dale has helped so many people get back into life, while not avoiding the reality of death. I am glad that here at Snyder we value the "special occasion" ministries of our church, but that we also value the "everyday" ministries too. If you know of someone who is grieving, tell them about the Snyder Grief Support Group. It meets every Tuesday at 10 am in Room B1033.
