Women's Ministry

Our Women's Ministry strives to provide mission education and personal growth opportunities for women. Some of the special activities include: Women's Sunday, Bible Study groups, prayer support groups, mission education and reading roundtable groups, mission action, Beth Moore Bible studies and retreats.

Men's Ministry

This ministry provides opportunities for men to grow in their personal and spiritual lives through large and small group activities and to do hands-on mission ministry. Some of the special activities include: an annual Fall Kick-off for the men and boys, Bike Ministry, Habitat for Humanity Ministry, Carpentry Ministry, and Small Group Prayer/Bible Study groups.

Senior Adult Ministry

Snyder Memorial has an active Senior Adult ministry. PrimeTimers, as they call themselves, meet monthly on the fourth Thursday to hear a program on a timely topic of interest to senior adults and to have lunch as the church's guests. They sponsor trips to various places for sight-seeing, shopping and to see shows. They also attend Senior Adult Conferences and Retreats. Senior Adult Ministries include: The Philadelphia Ministry, Childcare for MOPS and the Casserole Ministry. PrimeTimers Choir meets on Monday mornings at 9:00am to rehearse and have fun together. Prime Timers' newest program is called PrimeTime Thursdays. Our senior adults meet each Thursday at 1:00pm in the Gathering Hall for games such as bridge, canasta, Rummikub, and various dominoes games.

Singles Ministry

Younger Singles (18-24) activities center around their Sunday School group and its activities. These groups provide opportunities for Bible Study and building relationships. The Journey (20-30's) is the center of small group Bible studies, mission activities, picnics, retreats, etc. Mature Singles (40 and over) find companionship and purpose in group activities as well as Bible Study each Sunday.

Military Ministry

We recognize the impact our military has on our community and the freedoms we all enjoy. Because of this, we not only want to offer in-reach ministries to our own church members who serve in our armed forces; but also out-reach ministries to those folks we don't yet know. Snyder sends care packages to our members and members' family who are deployed overseas. Many Snyder families are committed to supporting our military families, especially during times of deployment, and providing regular support and fellowship. During the Christmas season, we provide several evenings of free childcare so that our military families can shop or take care of holiday errands.

Pastoral Care and Prayer Ministry

Sometimes we need help getting through what life puts before us. Snyder offers counseling services, education and support groups to help folks in times of need. Everyone on the ministerial staff is available to help any way they can. Snyder's Prayer Team would be glad to include you in their prayer ministry. You do not have to attend Snyder. Recreational Ministry

Snyder Memorial has a full-size gymnasium with basketball and volleyball courts. The gym is open at various times for Snyder members. We have Church League basketball teams for (grades 4-6), Junior High and Senior High. Girls in grades 1-6 may play in the Girl's League which plays here at Snyder and is sponsored by Snyder and other organizations. Sign up in November to participate in the leagues that play January - March. In the spring and summer we have softball teams for men and women that play in the city recreation department's leagues. The Recreation committee sponsors golf tournaments in the spring and summer, family fun days and various other recreational activities for various age groups.

Library Ministry

Few church libraries can offer the resources of Snyder's Church Library. Over 12,000 books, audio tapes and video tapes are available for your pleasure and enlightenment. The latest Christian best sellers and most in-demand theological resources are available. Our collection of children's videos, both Christian oriented and "just for fun," is extensive and adults can find the good old movies. Books on tape are becoming more and more popular and we have a wide variety of those as well. Sunday School

Sunday School is not only an opportunity for Bible Study but it is an entry point for meeting new friends and interacting with a smaller group of people. Sunday School provides fellowship opportunities, a caring network for those in the group and a framework for ministry opportunities. Our Sunday School classes meet from 9:45 - 10:45am.

Preschoolers, Children and Youth

Sunday School is age-graded, particularly through Grade 12. Bed Babies, Creepers and Toddlers are promoted developmentally so they may be moved up any time during the year if the Preschool Director feels they are ready for the next department. For everyone else Promotion Day is generally the last Sunday in August. In accord with the fact that children enter school based on the age they are on August 31, Preschoolers 2-K are assigned to class based on the age they are on August 31. Grades 1-12 go by school grade.

Adults

Adults are age-graded but we do not adhere to strict guidelines. Age groups given for classes are guidelines to help newcomers have some idea of the folks who are in the group and who will be at the same stage in life and have similar likes and needs. Most classes are co-ed. Age-graded classes generally use the Uniform Lesson Series from Smyth and Helwys but some of the younger groups use other literature from time to time for special interest studies.

They preached the good news in that city and won a large number of disciples. Then they returned to Lystra, Iconium and Antioch, strengthening the disciples and encouraging them to remain true to the faith. Paul and Barnabas appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, committed them to the Lord, in whom they had put their trust. After going through Pisidia, they came into Pamphylia, and when they had preached the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia.

From Attalia they sailed back to Antioch, where they had been committed to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On arriving there, they gathered the church together and reported all that God had done through them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles. And they stayed there a long time with the disciples.

Missions

Snyder folks are very involved in both financially supporting missions and in hands-on mission activities. One fourth of our church budget goes to support missions at home and around the world. More than five hundred people participate in Operation Inasmuch each year. Others are involved in Sunday School class mission projects, the Bike Ministry, the Carpentry Ministry, Interfaith Hospitality House, and other mission activities. Snyder members support our food drives which come with every Singing Christmas Tree, school supply drives and breakfast programs for Margaret Willis School, Operation Christmas Child and supplies for mission trips, and on and on. Literally, hundreds have participated in overseas mission trips and emergency repair teams across the south. If you like to be a part of missions, here's your chance. We'd love to see every member "on mission" in their lifestyle!

We have built eight Habitat for Humanity Houses and were the originators of Operation Inasmuch, a once a year one day endeavor where our members participate in many hands-on mission projects. Operation Inasmuch has become a national organization that launched in April 1995.

Snyder Memorial Baptist Church is the mother church of Arran Lake Baptist Church, Village Drive Baptist Church, and Fayetteville Korean Baptist Church.

Snyder is also actively going out from its church walls to help others through mission trips. Church-wide trips have included working within the United States with Appalachian Outreach and Touching Miami with Love. The church has also sponsored trips to Kenya, Haiti and Cuba as well as music mission trips to England and the Czech Republic.

Snyder also has two disaster relief teams formed through the North Carolina Baptist Men. We own our own disaster relief trailer that has already been put to use with trips to the Gulf Coast to help after Hurricane Katrina. Snyder also supports some of its own members in full-time missions.

Missions

Children's Choirs

The following groups meet each week (September-April) from 5:45 until 6:25pm:

- Music Time - 3s (3-years old)
- Music Time - 4s (4-years old)
- Music Time - 5s (5-years old)
- Music Makers 1 (first grade)
- Music Makers 2 (second grade)
- Music Makers 3 (third grade)
- Young Musicians (fourth - sixth grade)

We also offer special performance opportunities every other summer called "ENCORE." Our older children are frequently included in The Singing Christmas Tree. Children in grades 1-6 perform in morning worship 2-3 times each year.

Youth Choir

Youth Choir is for grades 7-12. They rehearse each Sunday, 5:15-6:15pm in the Music Suite, Room B2040. This group sings for our morning worship services several times each year, participates in special projects such as The Singing Christmas Tree, attends state and national choral festivals, and takes an annual mini-tour each spring.

Music Academy

Our Snyder Music Academy was established to provide quality music instruction in a Christian setting to the Fayetteville community. The program offers private and group instruction for a wide variety of ages from young children to mature adults.

Handbells

Adult Handbell Choir is for adults who can read music and have some previous playing experience. They meet on Monday afternoons, 4:15-5:00pm in the Handbell Room, Room B2016. Youth Handbells is for grades 7-12. They meet on Sundays, 4:30-5:10pm in the Handbell Room, Room B2016. Music reading is helpful.

Ensembles

Ladies' Ensemble rehearses on Mondays, 5:00-5:45pm in the Music Suite, Room B2040. Participation is open by audition or invitation.

Men's Ensemble rehearses on Mondays beginning at 12noon in the Music Suite, Room B2040. Participation is open by audition or invitation.

Adult Choirs

The Sanctuary Choir meets every Wednesday, 7:15-8:45pm in the Music Suite, Room B2040. No audition required. This group is primarily responsible for leading in worship each Sunday at 11am. The Singing Christmas Tree is produced each year by this choir.

Prime Time Singers choir is designed for singers over fifty. They rehearse on Mondays, 9-10:00am in the Music Suite, Room B2040. There is no audition required. The Prime Time Singers also sing and lead worship services at local retirement centers. The group usually attends a state music festival each spring.

A New Way Worship Team is a team of instrumentalists and vocalists who meet every Wednesday, beginning at 7:15pm. This group leads in worship at A New Way gathering each Sunday at 8:40am. An audition is required for participation.

A New Way Worship Choir meets periodically to include a larger number of singers to rehearse and lead worship in A New Way gathering, typically on the third Sunday of each month. No audition is required. Contact Giles Blankenship at the church office if interested.

Orchestra

Snyder Orchestra includes advanced level high school players, college students, and several adults with extensive playing experience.

We also have several professional musicians from our area who have agreed to help us develop this ministry. Participation requires at least 5 years of group or private instruction. Individuals with less experience may audition. The group performs approximately twelve times each year.

Youth Strings is open to students age 10-18 (no audition required). Younger students may participate with permission from the director. This entire group will rehearse on Sundays in the Sanctuary from 4:30-5:10pm.

Family Night

Family Night is held on Wednesdays beginning in September and ending in April. Supper is served buffet style in the Fellowship Hall from 4:50 until 5:45pm. Family Night is designed to provide fellowship time for the church family around the table, to consolidate missions and music activities for children and to provide spiritual growth opportunities for youth and adults.

Nursery (Ages Birth - 2)

The nursery is open from 5:45pm until after Adult choir rehearsals, both New Way and Sanctuary choirs, are over. Please bring diapers and bottles for your child and label them with your child's name.

Preschoolers (Ages 3-5)

Preschoolers have Music Activities from 5:45 to 6:25pm and then they are taken by their workers to Mission Friends which dismisses at 7:15pm. Children must be three by August 31 to participate in this program. Older preschoolers may be left in the nursery during choir rehearsals, but it is the parent's responsibility to take them from Mission Friends to the Nursery Suite.

Children (Grades 1-6)

Children in grades first through sixth have age-graded choirs from 5:45-6:25pm. At 6:30pm they participate in mission education programs: Girls in Action (GA) for girls and Royal Ambassadors (RA) for boys.

Children (Grades 4-6)

Children in grades fourth through sixth may go to the gym for supervised play after supper until choir begins at 5:45pm. They should not be allowed to roam the halls.

Youth (Grades 7-12)

Youth activities begin at 5:30pm with STEPS OF FAITH, an interpretive dance group. The gym opens at 5:50pm for all youth and at 6:15pm Youth classes/ministries begin.

Adult Prayer Time

Each Wednesday evening adults share a brief intercessory prayer time and a short devotional time around the tables in the Fellowship Hall. After prayer time adults have a choice of seminars.

Adult Spiritual Growth Opportunities

Seminars begin at 6:15pm and are offered in the Fall (September through November) and then again in the Winter and Spring (February through April). In January, all adults participate in a joint Winter Bible Study together.
