COVID-19 One-Day Testing Site August 19th 4:00-6:30pm

Snyder is partnering with the Goshen Medical Center (Faison, NC) to host a one-day COVID-19 Testing Site on our campus.

Great! How do I sign up? We're asking that those

who wish to be tested, call the Church Office (910) 484-3191 to reserve a time slot.

We'll send you a registration form that you can pre-fill to save you some time when you arrive.

Where do I go? This is a "curb-side" testing. Just pull in to the Fellowship Hall parking lot and someone will direct you.

Is there a Cost? There will be no out of pocket cost with the presentation of an insurance card (a copy will be made at registration).

What about the test results? Goshen Medical will call you with your test results in 2-3 days. If no one answers, they will send you a letter with the information.

Missions Giving Update



Each year, we invite you to fill out a commitment card to indicate how much you plan to give in the coming year. There's no pressure; we mostly offer it because for many it's a helpful prompt for having the family discussion about giving, why we give, and how much we

give. At the present time, about half our members participate in this way.

We also invite you to choose one of the giving plans: A, B, C or D. Choosing a giving plan allows a tenth of your giving to be directed to one of the cooperative giving programs - the Baptist State Convention of NC, The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of NC, or to our international mission partners: Missions of Hope International in Kenya, Grace Christian Mission in Myanmar and Haiti Outreach Ministries in Haiti. You don't have to choose a giving plan annually; it stays the same until you choose to change it.

Beginning with this week's Bell, each month we'll publish the total of the previous month's giving through the giving plans. It's amazing how much good we can accomplish when we all work together!

Pastor's Perspective

Last week didn't exactly unfold as I had planned. In addition to my regular weekly meetings and sermon preparation for Sunday, I had hoped to get some long-term planning done on my fall sermon series. Bruce was on a much-needed and well-deserved week of vacation. I just needed a relatively quiet week of productive days and everything would be good. Two church members died early in the week and I ended up doing one of the funerals on Friday... the day I normally try to take as my Sabbath. Please don't hear me complaining. I'm not. It's part of and parcel of being in ministry and I could not be more fulfilled in what God has called me to do here at Snyder. His grace has always been sufficient for my needs, both personal and professional.

The funeral was for a very dear sister in Christ. Because of her clear faith in Jesus, it was an "easy" funeral to preach. I ended up framing her service from the story in Luke's gospel about two sisters who entertained Jesus in their home one day. Martha was busy making all of the necessary preparations. I'm sure that included preparing a meal for Jesus to eat. She was frustrated that her sister, Mary, was just sitting at Jesus' feet, not helping her at all. I began the service comparing Zula to Martha, because she was always busy doing for others. In her home, in her church, and in her community. But I concluded the service by comparing her to Mary, too. Zula's Bible clearly indicated she spent many hours of her life at the feet of Jesus as she studied His Word.

Her service on Friday reminded me of the breathless pace I tend to keep in ministry, and a book I haven't yet read but its title resonates deeply with me. Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World: Finding Intimacy with God in the Busyness of Life by Joanna Weaver. I need to confess to you that this is sometimes hard for me... even as a pastor. I love spending time in quietness before the Lord and in reading His Word. But the busyness of life - indeed the demands of ministry - work incessantly to pull me away into the world of Martha. I firmly believe there is a healthy balance between the two. I just pray that we - you and I - can find that balance. For our well-being and for His glory.
