Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child is a 'global Christmas gift exchange' project operated by Samaritan's Purse. Each November it opens thousands of locations, typically at churches or schools, to collect shoeboxes filled with toys, school supplies, personal items and other gifts. These boxes are then distributed as Christmas gifts, accompanied by Christian literature. From 1993 through 2016, some 124 million gift boxes were handed out in more than 150 countries. Snyder's goal last year was 1500 boxes. Snyder also sends volunteers to help at the Processing Center in Charlotte.

Snyder is a transport church on Tuesday nights if it is a white flag night. Volunteers are always needed to drive our church vans to transport those in need of shelter. The Salvation Army makes the call by midmorning and calls our coordinator (Duncan Hubbard). Duncan then calls those on our list to find someone available to drive that evening around 7pm. The driver will also need to pick up and return the people to the Salvation Army on Wednesday morning.
