**Pastor's Perspective**

I watched the best basketball game I have ever seen this past weekend. It was the second game of the Final Four matchups to determine who would play Baylor for the National Championship. Gonzaga was the favorite as the only team to be undefeated all season and blowing out most opponents by double digits. UCLA was the lowest seed to get to the Final Four. An 11 seed versus the overall #1 seed in the country. But, they had already beaten the #1 and #2 seeds in their region, earning the right to be there. Most people didn't give UCLA much of a chance. One commentator said they would have to play a perfect game to have any chance of winning. Since the game was late on the night before Easter Sunday, this preacher couldn't stay up to watch the second half live. But what I saw in the first half made me ask Gaye to record the second half so I could watch it later.

The UCLA Bruins played about as perfect a game as any college basketball team can play. Shooting an incredibly efficient percentage, they were down only one point at the half. They continued that level of play in the second half and sent the high-scoring game into overtime. Against an exceptionally talented and dominant basketball team. The game was tied with 3.3 seconds on the clock in overtime when Gonzaga inbounded the ball at their end of the court. It looked like the game was probably headed to a second overtime. Until a Gonzaga player launched an incredibly long shot from just inside the half-court line that banked off the backboard and into the basket for a 93-90 win. No one knew how that game would end until it ended at the buzzer. Best basketball game I have ever watched.

Between watching the two halves of that game, I celebrated Jesus' resurrection with my church family here at Snyder. I got emotional seeing so many smiling faces back in person after such a long year. I reflected that evening on why Easter Sunday is so special. The single best attended Sunday every year. Without oversimplifying the answer, it is because we know how the story ends. Jesus wins! And all of us who place our faith in Him also win! Our calling in life is to do our very best until the final buzzer to live in such a way that others will make it to the winner's circle with us. There is too much at stake to do otherwise.

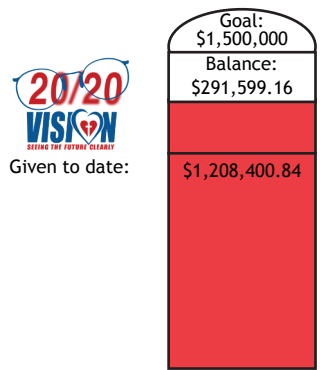
